



## Waste Hunger Not Food Kern County Letter Grade Policy

Waste Hunger Not Food Kern County takes edible, surplus food from schools, restaurants and markets that otherwise may be wasted and distributes it to those in need. We are partnering with restaurants, markets, schools and other food facilities in our county to distribute food to people in our community that struggle with hunger. We would like to reward participating food facilities by placing the Waste Hunger Not Food logo on their Environmental Health Division Inspection Grade Card. (see below).

Listed below are the criteria for participating food facilities to receive the Waste Hunger Not Food Grade Card.

### Criteria:

1. Food establishment must have received a letter A grade during their health inspection. While you can participate in Waste Hunger Not Food Kern County even if your facility has not received an A, only facilities that have scored an A will receive the logo.
2. The food facility must donate food an average of once per week **OR**
3. The food facility must donate an average of 300 lbs of food per month.
4. The food facility must comply with all provision for donor sites as outlined in the Waste Hunger Not Food Kern County program documents.

Grade cards for food facilities entering the program will be distributed at their next scheduled inspection and reissued thereafter at each inspection they are in compliance with the above criteria.
